Look up, Look down, Look all around!

We are going to explore lots of fabulous opportunities linked to our changing environment as the season transitions to Spring from Winter. We will learn about taking care of plants from seed through to shoot and eventually flower. This will also link to taking care of our environment from looking after resources to environmental adaptations such as turning off lights and recycling. Our half term value is 'Happiness'. We will explore this through how we know we are happy, what makes us happy and how we can share happiness. We will also talk about how we cna get back to a feeling of happiness if we are sad, cross or any other feeling.

At Home: Play games to explore positional vocabulary-

firstly describing a position for your child to represent e.g. "sit under the table" then asking them to use the vocabulary

Physical Development

Focus: • Standing on one foot as an example of a balance

• Begin to use a controlled grip when using mark making tools (holding between thumb and two fingers)

Vocabulary

scissor hold, accurate, follow line, balance, pencil grip, fingers and thumb

At Home:

Encourage your child to make marks using various materials not just pens/ pencils on paper. This can be using chalks outside, painting using water and large paint brushes outside, making marks using tools in playdough.

Support your child with some age appropriate independence skills such as putting on their own shoes, putting on their coat and pulling the zip up once started.

<u>Classroom vocabulary:</u>

<u>Carpet listening</u> children will know that when we are on the carpet we listen to the person who is talking and if we would

like to share our ideas we put our hands up

<u>Recycle</u>- when something can be used again by being made into something new

Grapheme- the letter shape

Phoneme - the sound made by the grapheme

Expressive Arts and Design

Focus:

- Exploring using different voice sounds when singing and reciting rhymes
- Begin to make up their own songs when playing or changing words in familiar rhymes
- Begin to link feelings to representations in drawings and creations
- Use different joining materials when creating such as glue, tape and paperclips
- Showing interest in and describing the texture of things
- Represent themselves by using closed shapes such as a circle for their head

Vocabulary:

voice sounds, loud, quite, fast, slow, high, low, join, fix, texture, soft, smooth, rough, hard

<u>At Home:</u>

When your child is exploring odel using vocabulary to describe how objects feel to the touch e.g. soft. When sharing stories look at the different feelings of the characters and say how this is represented through the drawings.

Focus:

- Talking and asking questions about the natural world
- Talking about what they have noticed and changes in the seasons
- Talking about animals, plants and other objects in nature
- Talking about and taking part in growing
- Continue to develop a positive attitude about the differences between people
- Know that some people celebrate Easter
- Talk about special people in our lives and how we can celebrate them
- Begin to understand and engage in some environmentally friendly routines, such as recycling and turning off taps.

At Home:
