 Nightingale (Yr2), Edith Cavell (Yr 2), Mary Seacole (Yr 2) and Guy Fawkes (Yr 2).






Key Vocabulary	
bakery	A shop where bread is made and sold.
diary	A book that people write about their lives in.
St Paul's Cathedral	A large church in London. This was rebuilt by Sir Christopher Wren after the fire.
17 th Century	This is the time from 1601-1700. The Great Fire of London happened in 1666 – this was in the 17 th Century.
River Thames	This is the river that runs through the middle of London.

Spread of the Fire

- Sunday 2nd September 1666
- Monday 3rd September 1666
- Tuesday and Wednesday
 4-5th September 1666



Monday 3rd September 1666

The fire gets very close to the Tower of London.

Tuesday 4th September 1666

St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed by the fire.

Timeline of Events

Sunday 2nd September 1666

The fire starts at around 1 a.m.

Mid-morning: Samuel Pepys starts to write about the fire in his diary.

Wednesday 5th September 1666

The wind dies down and the fire spreads more slowly.

Thursday 6th September 1666

The fire is finally put out.

Thousands of people are left homeless.
