Human Features of the Seaside

Human features found at the seaside might include the pier, the promenade, a lighthouse and a fairground. These features are all man-made.

Key vocabulary

Town	A compactly settled area that is usually larger than a village but smaller than a city.
City	The largest kind of settlements and often have millions of people living in them.
Village	Small settlements with a small number of houses for a few hundred people.
Farm	A piece of land used to grow crops and/or raise animals for produce.
Harbour	A section along the coastline where the ship and other water vessels are parked or stored.
Port	A place where boats can come and go to load and unload their supplies/people.
Shop	A building or part of a building where goods or services are sold.
Landmark	A feature of a landscape or place that is easily recognised.
