#### **Attendance Matters!**

At Giles Brook we place great importance on good attendance and punctuality. We know that a child's attendance has a direct impact on their learning. Those children who are regularly late or absent from school do not achieve their potential and do fall behind in class. An attendance rate of 90% means that your child is missing half a day per week of learning.

Letters will be sent home today informing you if your chld has an attendance rate below 95%. We do understand that at this time of year there's illnesses circulating or there has been extentuating circumstances, but it is important that you are kept informed. We are monitoring very carefully those children's whose attendance rate is below 90%. Our attendance policy is on the website should you require further information. Thank you.




#### **Anti Bullying Week**
