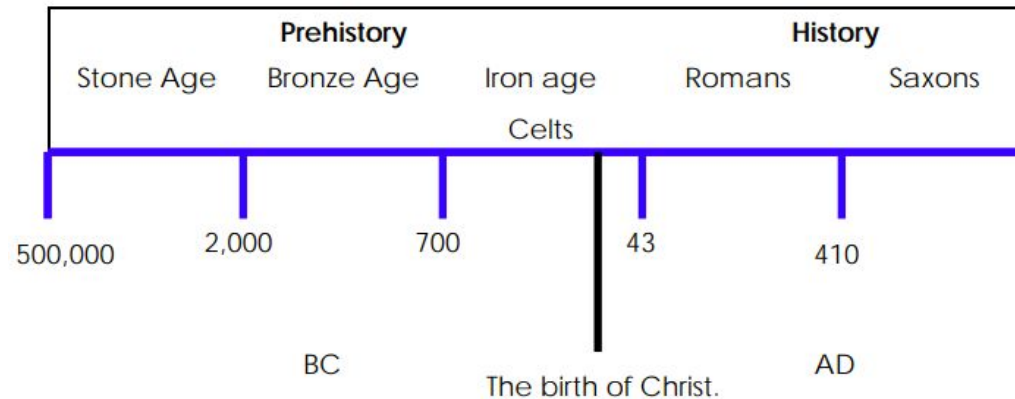

Key Vocabulary

AD	AD is used to show the dates after the birth of Jesus.
Agriculture	The process of cultivating land to grow crops and rear animals for food
BC	Before Christ
Bronze	A metal alloy or mixture made from copper and tin.
Bronze Age	A period of time between the Stone and Iron Ages.
Celts	A modern term for people living in Europe during the Iron Age
Iron	A metal that is stronger and harder than bronze.
Iron Age	Iron Age is the name given to the time period from approximately 500 BC to 43 AD in Britain.
Hunter-Gatherer	a member of a nomadic people who live chiefly by hunting and fishing, and harvesting wild food.
Prehistoric	Time period before written records
Settlement	A place where people develop a community
Stone Age	The earliest period of human culture when stone tools were first used.
